KOITO to Establish a New Company in Indonesia

KOITO MANUFACTURING CO., LTD. (Head Office: Minato-ku, Tokyo; President: Masahiro Ohtake) announced that it will establish a new company to manufacture and market automotive lighting equipment, PT. INDONESIA KOITO, in Karawang Regency, Indonesia, in response to growing orders for lighting products for four-wheeled and two-wheeled vehicles.

With the world's fourth largest population (about 230 million) as well as abundant resources including natural gas, coal, and oil, the production of both four-wheeled and two-wheeled automobiles in Indonesia is expected to expand.

The new company will be KOITO GROUP's second production base in the ASEAN region, following THAI KOITO COMPANY LIMITED. Through the collaboration of these two companies, we will strive to gain new orders, improve productivity including mutually supplementing business operations between the bases, thereby boosting our business in the ASEAN region.
